Resolution 43-2018

Establish the Cemetery Capital Project

Offered by Supervisor McKenna, seconded by Councilwoman Ricci:

WHEREAS, the Woodstock Cemetery Board resigned, effective December 12th, 2017, and

WHEREAS, the plot owners at a plot owners meeting held on January 6th, 2018 did not vote in a new board, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, the Town of Woodstock take ownership and control of the Woodstock Cemetery, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, to establish the Woodstock Cemetery Capital Project fund #.085 for all costs associated with the operating of the Woodstock Cemetery, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the Supervisor shall deposit all Cemetery funds into Woodstock Cemetery Capital #.085.

All voted 5-0:

Councilwoman Ricci - aye

Councilman Wenk - aye

Supervisor McKenna stated the Town is obligated to take the cemetery once it is "abandoned". He feels the Town can run the cemetery at a lower cost than the private sector. He said the Town would have to hire another Custodial Member to help with the added duties of the cemetery. That person would work part time cemetery, and part time maintenance.
