




Quantity of responses analyzed




Popularity of Items Within Each Theme




Popularity of Sports, games, fitness and health items



Programs Open Ended Responses:

- Kids movement, community workouts/track
- Outdoor music, swimming - including lessons and things like water aerobics
- Music room and table tennis, pool room
- Cooking workshops, garden education, toddler activities, movies, avenues to bring back graduated teens/young adults to be peer mentors or group leaders for summer programming for teens, cross-generational programs
- Class for kids, adults and seniors. Dance, art, writing, etc
- I would like to see a larger outdoor pool, or maybe even an indoor pool... open to the public, instead of only open for kids' summer camp. I would like to see some musical gatherings, such as bluegrass jams or acoustic hootenanny jam sessions... maybe some open electric blues jams in the indoor space.
- The repair cafe is great, would love to see more in the vein of community skill shares and things like a maker space or tool share.
- Farmers market, out door movies,
- Educational (using the different facilities involved, potentially using volunteers [teens, community members]), entertainment (movie nights? Music?)
- We would like to see community access during summer. Closures for camp have been disruptive.
- Swim lessons!
- Farmer's market, performances, fairs, kids soccer leagues
- After school programing for children and youth. Similar to Boys and Girls club in Saugerties. Hire the older kids to watch the younger ones, tutoring, cooking, games etc...
- Dedicated Pickle Ball courts
- Intergenerational programs, day care for smaller kids, makers area, collaboration with the Historical Society, Library and school district
- Community carnivals & festivals (kid centered), arts & crafts, community service, peer art or fashion shows, speed friending, Magic the gathering/ D&D nights, food vendors at a movie night, kite building event competition, snowperson building competitions, stargazing club, inexpensive camp for Woodstock residents, community art making or interactive art, poetry readings, Easter egg hunts/ relay races, teen dance/live music/open mic night, workouts,
- Community-focused children's events like nature walks, musical performances, animal lectures, etc.
- Youth center to support youth classes cooking, outdoor skills, organized sports pickup games, tutoring, arts and crafts. Also field trips to local places of interest.
- Arts, Sciences and Civil Service/Civics
- Group exercise, education, youth theatre

Suggestions Open Ended:

- An indoor pool is my biggest dream! It would be wonderful to teach our littlest how to swim, and is easy on the joints for our older/injured residents. We could look to the Arkville pool as a model. It's wonderful, but an hour away.
- Safer pedestrian and bicycle infrastructure; bike shelter + bike racks + bike fix it station
- The slash pad and improved town pool are imperative. We need a public town pool. You can charge a small amount.
- I would like an off-leash, fenced in dog run added to the list of uses for the property.
- I got an error message trying to click on the PowerPoint, so not sure what all has been discussed or budgeted for. It would be great to have some shaded areas in the playground. I really like the woodlands path and would definitely be in favor of keeping it over cutting down any trees to make way for new facilities if that's on the table? I'm less in touch with the needs of seniors and youth at the Rec center so would refrain from comment there, but generally happy to see the facilities improved
- A covered picnic area near the playground would be nice. Reconfiguring the playground so it isn't all in a row would be nice.
- Shade at playground: through planting trees (for the long haul) and with awnings or structures to provide more shade at playground.
- Pool access in the summer, indoor sports facilities for winter use, music and arts programming.
- TV station can be improved and highschool could have a tech club with students that would want to learn about audio/video TV station broadcasting. Hiring a tech person to run and train the interested students on a rotation basis
- I have a lot of ideas for programming (It was my job for many years & am happy to help)
- Great job and thanks for taking so much time and effort to make this space more useable to the community!
- I think the youth center and providing a place for kids 12-18 to feel safe and have fun should be a priority. Growing up in this town I didn't feel like there was any place for me between those ages, the youth center existed but it was mostly boys playing video games or skating neither of which felt accessible to me. The only other option was smoking weed (or worse) at the millstream. This is exactly the type of organizing our town needs. Thank you! -Tessa Delisio
- To work with the Housing Committee to create some affordable housing for our community.
- Incorporate space for modest housing
- Transportation to community center for seniors unable to drive
- Transportation for Senior
- Our community desperately needs a pool that people who are not rich enough to have their own can cool off in in the summer. It would also be great to have an indoor pool to enable community members to access this great form of exercise (particularly great for seniors) all year round. An indoor tennis court would also be a huge draw.
- I would like to see things for everyone. Seniors, kids and people with disabilities.
- I would like to see the current run down facilities modernized without going overboard.
- Redo the tennis courts, more pickle ball courts

- Keep cost down. Utilize community center in your planning
- In addition to recreation and space for youth I believe that there could be a small cafe or meeting space where the elders of our community could meet up.
- Improve community engage on this project through service and communication
- Make the skatepark available to all. There's a vibrant skateboard community in the surrounding area with limited options for public parks.
- I suggest concentrating on the youth center, new outdoor pool and improving/adding tennis courts
- Town board members should participate in the public be heard session on September 5.
- Year round access. Denying access to playground facilities during summer camp facilities is problematic and limits other children and their parents from using this public park.
- Special events for youth, Organize trips for the community to outside events for people who cannot drive
