CSAC Proposal from the Historical Society of Woodstock

Background and Description of Project:

Founded in 1929 and chartered by the Board of Regents of New York State, the mission of the Historical Society of Woodstock is to preserve, interpret, and share the unique history of Woodstock, New York. In addition to our exhibits, talks and special events, the Society maintains a large archival collection covering the breath of Woodstock history - from the 1700s to today. Open to the public and researchers by appointment, the archives currently maintains over 9,000 items in our database, including: photographs, diaries, periodicals, letters, maps, deeds, account books, analog and digital recordings, government, and organizational records, and much more. In addition, the Historical Society archives also includes a fine art collection of more than 750 works, many by noted artists of the Woodstock art colony. In short, the full scope of our town's history resides within the archives of the Historical Society of Woodstock.

To further maintain and to ensure proper care for this important collection, the Society is proposing to construct a new structure that will house the important materials entrusted to our care. Thanks to a generous donation recently received by the Society from the estate of longtime Board member, Jean White, the long-sought goal of a state-of-the-art, metal framed, environmentally sound storage facility is within sight. The building is projected to be 28' x 40' in size, the majority of which will be dedicated to archival storage. The remainder of the space (See attached diagram) will be dedicated to office space for the archivists, a digital reproduction area, and an area for researchers to conduct their work. A small utility closet and restroom is also included - with close proximity to septic and well.

Current Archival Storage:

For some years, the archives have been stored on the second floor of the current building. The current building is a wood structure, not well insulated and due to the inherent nature of an older wood building, difficult to maintain basic climate control. These are not optimal conditions for such an important collection. Obviously, a wood structure is susceptible to fire. And while that is a major factor and fear, the current building, which is approximately 100 years old, is subject to moisture. Again, not conducive to effective archival storage

In addition, the Society's art collection is currently housed upstairs, above the police station. And, while certainly secure, the town uses that space for records storage and is in need of the space we occupy for their own storage.

Finally, due to the large size of the Society's collection, the current archival space is simply out of room. The Society, literally, has little space left to add future collections.

C: Reasons Why: The Historical of Woodstock, an all-volunteer 501(c)(3) organization, has occupied its current area and buildings since the 1980s. For the last twenty years, under a lease agreement with the Town of Woodstock, the Society has made numerous improvements to the site and the building at its own expense, including: a handicap accessible bathroom, new electrical system and panel, new plumbing system, trac lighting, installation of an HVAC system, painting - exterior and interior, interior room restoration, landscaping, and maintenance of grounds, etc. In short, the Society has been a good steward of the property. And yet, as noted above, the current archival storage area is simply not adequate for professionally preserving such a valuable collection.

As this is a government area and such construction would be permitted under the easement, we believe the Society has demonstrated not only its care and protection of the property but have given new life to a site that had been previously ignored.

The proposed plan will help to ensure that Woodstock's history will be properly stored, cared for, and maintained for future generations of Woodstockers, researchers and visitors.

D: Site Plan - see attached.

E: Erosion: In reality, this plan will assist in controlling erosion that is an issue on the property. Currently the water runoff from the above parking lot runs down and collects in the Alf Evers Park area and around and under the current building. Plans would include improving and effectively dealing with this issue through proper drainage.

F: Drainage - As above and attached, a system of footing drains will be installed to redirect the flow of water from above.

G: Landscaping - Over the past few years, three (aged) apple trees in the area have been lost to storms. Plans would include planting Jonathan Apple trees as replacements. (The Jonathan Apple, as you know, was developed in Woodstock by Peter Rick) This has been previously discussed with a member of the tree committee. Additional landscaping could include native flower beds around the proposed building.

H: Schematic Drawings - See Attached

I: Signage - The only sign that would be needed is a small sign by the entrance indicating the archives.

J: Lighting - The only exterior lighting required will be a downlight illuminating the front door and a couple of can ceiling lights under the porch. No lighting would protrude outward from the building.

Site Plan Details:

- 1. Location - Government area.** The structure would be placed where a current "Brad's Barn" is... to the left of the current building and set back from the driveway. Currently staked with flags.

2. **Proposed Area of Disturbance:** Building dimensions - 28' x 40' and 20' high (lower than current building per code.)
3. As noted above in "E" and "F" - Improvements will be made regarding the drainage issue on the property.
4. **Intrusion into Wetlands - None**

Landscaping Details:

1. As noted in "G" above - three Jonathan Apple trees to be planted on site which will partially shade the proposed building as well as the bluestone bench area on the property. Once constructed, flower beds will be appropriately placed.
2. **Plantings: Jonathan Apple trees.**


Schematics:

2. **Architectural Style -** The building style is designed to match the style of the current building - including a gambrel roof and front porch. The building also includes barnlike features befitting our rural area and history.
3. **Grading -** Grading will be kept to a minimum in relation to the building's footprint and improved drainage system.

As the Historical Society of Woodstock moves closer to celebrating its 100th anniversary, we believe there is no better time to ensure that the record of Woodstock's remarkable history is properly maintained and housed for future generations.

Artist rendering of proposed design (a bit out of scale and color is for illustration only - we welcome suggestions on color):





Location will be where Brad's Barn is on left. Ground is already partially leveled. Barn will be relocated to other part of driveway (see next page). Footprint of proposed building is staked.
