The Livingston Regiment historically refers to the Manor of Livingston Regiment (also known as the 10th Albany Regiment), a Revolutionary War-era militia unit raised in Columbia County, NY, under the command of Colonel Peter R. Livingston.

The New York State militia was vital to the American Revolution, and the Livingston Regiment played an active role in several key engagements.

Manor of Livingston Regiment (Revolutionary War)

Designation: 10th Regiment, Albany County Militia

Commander: Colonel Peter R. Livingston (1776–1777), later succeeded by Colonel Morris Graham

Major Engagements: Battle of White Plains (October 1776) and Battle of Stillwater (September 1777)
